

# Sally Blanchard

Sally Blanchard was a pioneering expert in parrot behavior & proper nutrition.

When Sally brought home her first parrot, she realized that there wasn't much information on care. Avian veterinarians weren't a thing yet, there were no experts. This was a time when parrots were still wild caught, shoved into tiny round cages & fed seed.

Being an educator herself, Sally dove deep into research. She joined scientists in expeditions around the world to watch parrot behavior & diet in the wild. She spoke to every parrot owner she could find. Through the years, Sally took college level courses in animal behavior, anatomy, biology, field ecology, zoology, sociology, ornithology, psychology & nutrition.

Combining that education with what was learned watching wild parrots & interaction, Sally created the first applicable parrot behavior & training methodology.

Before there were parrot rescues, Sally would take in rehabilitate & rehome abandoned & neglected parrots. Sally was known as THE expert to call if your parrot was screaming & biting. She was the expert pet shops called when "viscous" wild caught parrots needed to be tamed (in under one hour!).

Before pellets, chop & sprouting, Sally was screaming from the mountaintops to feed parrots fresh food. She would even get into fights with veterinarians who believed that a seed diet was perfectly fine, for the sake of helping parrots thrive.

While being a mom to many adopted rescues, Sally was giving lectures on parrot behavior & training all over the world. She was a regular writer on parrot psychology for Bird Talk Magazine, Birds USA, Parrot World, Psittascene, Pet Age... and more. Sally authored numerous books to help educate others on proper parrot care & nutrition; as well as publishing her own Pet Bird Repost (Companion Parrots Quarterly) for 20 years.

So much of what we know today about parrot psychology, welfare, training & nutrition comes from Sally's pioneering information; unfortunately she is never credited. It's a shame that the younger generation & those newer to birds in the social media age didn't know her or what she did for our community & our precious companion parrots.

RIP, Sally. I miss you, my friend.
